- Fixed signs on second st

Garage

- "09" Freightliner- changed oil, greased chassis, removed front bumper and installed the head unit and head plow.
- 550 Will need new tires before winter
- F350- leaf box installed and is set for leaf duty
- 3500- no new issues
- 12 Freightliner- oil change, fuel filters and head plow are attached
- Roller- oil change, tune up, fuel tank became dislodged, will need repair
- Loader- no new issues
- Leaf Picker- new radiator installed. Currently has a bad alternator, it over charged the battery causing the death of the battery. Battery has been replaced and we are sourcing an alternator.
- Sweeper-recommend eliminating this unit.
- Sewer Jet- no new issues
- Skid Steer- No new issues
- Excavator- No new issues
- Monthly Fuel Tank Check and inspections
- Snowman-need to discuss this unit.

- Back Hoe- Minor air leaks in the front tires.
 We are keeping an eye on it and adding air.
 When time permits, we will break the tires down and reseal.
- Fuel tank Gauges- Buell stopped and started the process of installing- ongoing- still not complete
- Phone line installed as of 9/14/23. New problems have arisen. Alarm system is online. WIFI issues has been addressed with new router. Cable is still out, that needs to be addressed in the office and I have requested this.
- Mshaw training was today.
- 60-inch Mower-no new issues
- Water cart- repairing axle and sources bushings for the wheels over the winter season and taken out of service for Winter.
- 71" mower- had a drive seal leak, was sent to Charley Shahl for service. Seals on both sides were replaced with an upgraded seal as this is a known problem with the huskavarnas.
- Shared services with Salisbury and Oppenheim for road work.
- Shared services with Stratford for Road work as well.
- Manheim has requested and used several pieces of equipment.
- Still in the process of cleaning the garage.
- Cleaning up and reorganizing the salt shed area.
