**Water System Compliance and Improvements**

**1. EPA Administrative Order**

In response to the Administrative Order issued by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regarding elevated haloacetic acid (HAA5) levels, the following actions were undertaken:

- Collaborated with Amy, Neal, and the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH) to develop a comprehensive Corrective Action Plan (CAP), including enhanced hydrant flushing protocols as the targeted mitigation strategy after considering and discussing many options.
- Prepared a draft CAP (currently being reviewed by the Village), to be submitted in compliance with the 30-day deadline established by the EPA.

**2. Water Treatment Plant Operations**

Significant effort was dedicated to addressing ongoing water production challenges at the sand filtration plant:

- Provided support for the design and testing of new filter backwash piping to improve operational efficiency.
- Coordinated core sampling and analysis of the sand filter media using equipment loaned by the City of Little Falls.
- Conducted research into American Water Works Association (AWWA) standards for clearwell cleaning procedures, which will inform upcoming maintenance protocols.

### **Main Street Sewer Project**

- On November 12, 2024, I attended the pre-bid meeting for the Main Street Sewer Project held at Village Hall. Representatives from seven contractors were present, and additional contractors have obtained bid documents for consideration. As the bid package has been available for several weeks, minimal contractor questions were raised. Bids will be reviewed for recommendation at the December 16, 2024, Board of Trustees Meeting.

### **North Main Street Floodplain Creation and Preservation Project – NYSDEC Contract No. C01223GG**

- I prepared the grant closeout documentation for the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) and submitted to Amber for processing.

### **Fink Creek Storm Drainage System Project - FEMA Project No. 4472DR-NY [130884]**

- Cleaning and video inspection work is being planned for November 18, 2024.

### **Brayton Court Sewer Project**

- The Department of Public Works (DPW) has made substantial progress with the installation of the new sanitary sewer manhole at Brayton Court. I conducted multiple site inspections to monitor and coordinate this work, ensuring alignment with the Main Street Sewer Project and the proper function of gravity sewer flows.

### **NYSDEC Floodplain Correspondence**

- I have a draft response letter prepared for the NYSDEC, addressing the project sites across the Village that were noted in their recent floodplain permitting letter.
- This project has been on pause with the immediate needs of the EPA Administrative Order taking precedence.

WHEREAS, until 2024, cities, villages and towns had not received an increase in unrestricted state aid (AIM funding) in 15

years, significantly impacting their ability to provide essential services to their residents; and

WHEREAS, after a prolonged period without financial support, local governments finally received an increase of \$ 50 million in unrestricted state aid; and

WHEREAS, local officials express their gratitude for the % 50 million increase in unrestricted state aid, recognizing it as a positive step towards addressing long-standing funding challenges; and

WHEREAS, the State has referred to this new aid as Temporary Municipal Assistance, suggesting that such increase may not continue, jeopardizing the sustainability of crucial municipal programs and services; and

WHEREAS, the property tax cap further limits the ability of local governments is vital for maintain infrastructure, public safety, housing and other municipal services; and

WHEREAS, the challenges of inflation, the increasing costs of labor and supplies, and the end of extraordinary federal aid only accentuate the need for consistent and predictable funding to effectively plan for the future and meet the growing needs of their residents;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Village of Dolgeville calls upon the Governor and the State Legislature to commit to continuing the additional \$ 50 million in unrestricted state aid in the 2025-26 State Budget and beyond, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Village of Dolgeville urges state officials to recognize the need for a long-term plan that ensures consistent and predictable increases in financial support for local governments that keep pace with inflation.
