A Local Law to amend Sections 9-18, 9-19, 9-20
of the Village Code and to add new Section 9-25

Sec. 9-15. Definitions.

As used in this article, the following words, terms and phrases shall have the meanings herein ascribed to them:

Hawkers and peddlers: Any person, either principal or agent, who, in any public street or place or by going from place of business to place of business or from house to house, sells or barter or carries or exposes for sale any goods, wares or merchandise.

Solicitor, canvasser, or salesman. Any individual, traveling either by foot, automobile, motor truck or any other type of conveyance from place to place, from house to house, or from street to street, taking or attempting to take order for the sale of goods, wares and merchandise or personal property of any nature whatsoever for future delivery, or for services to be furnished or performed in the future, whether or not they carry or expose for sale a sample of such sale or whether they are collecting advance payments or not. Farmers and growers of farm and garden products shall not be included within this definition.

Section 9-16. Applicability of article.

This article shall not be held to apply to any sales conducted pursuant to statute or by order of any court, to any person selling personal property at wholesale to dealers, to farmers of truck gardeners who vend, sell or dispose of products of their own farms and gardens, to any person holding a license under the General Business Law; nor shall the provision of this article operate as an illegal interference with Interstate commerce.

Sec. 9-17. License required.

It shall be unlawful for any person within the corporate limits of the village to act as a hawker, peddler or solicitor as defined in Section 9-15 without first having obtained and paid for, and having in force and effect, a license therefor.

Sec. 9-18. License fee.

The fee for a license required by this article shall be ten dollars (\$10.00) per annum, and if the licensee shall have more than one person to whom or more than one vehicle for which he desires a license issued, there shall be an additional fee of ten dollars (\$10.00) for each license so issued.

Sec. 9-19. Application for license.

Any person desiring to procure a license required by this article shall file with the Village Clerk a written application upon a form furnished by the Village Clerk. Such application shall contain the following information:

- [a] The number and kind of vehicle to be used by the applicant in carrying on the business for which the license is desired.
- [b] The kind of goods, wares and merchandise the applicant desires to sell or the kind of service to be performed and the method of distribution of such merchandise.
- [c] The name, address and social security number of the applicant.
- [d] The name and address of the person, firm or corporation the applicant represents.
- [e] The length of time the applicant desires the license.

Section 9-20. Issuance of license.

Upon the filing of the application as provided in Section 19-9, the Village Clerk, shall upon approval of such application, issue to the applicant a license signed by said Clerk, upon payment of the necessary fee.

Section 9-21. License nontransferable.

All licenses issued under the provisions of this article shall be personal and nontransferable.

Section 9-22. Expiration of license.

All licenses issued under the provisions of this article shall expire on December thirty-first of each year after the issuance thereof.

Section 9-23. Revocation of license; fee not to be refunded; notice of revocation.

The Village Clerk may, at any time and for good reason, revoke any license issued hereunder and no refund of the license fee shall be given, but such revocation shall be effective only after the mailing of a notice thereof and the reasons to the licensee.

Section 9-24. License to carry license, exhibit same on demand.

Every person to whom a license has been issued under the provision of this article, shall carry such license and shall exhibit the same on request of any peace officer.

Section 9-25. Special events.

The Village Board shall have the right to assign the responsibility for issuing the permits to a Board-designated committee for special events, with the amount of fees for that specific event to be set by the Board-designated committee may be retained by such committee to be applied to the expenses of such special event.
